	areas moist or wet as this may spread the Cantharone to unwanted areas.
2.	After having Cantharone applied, you should wash it off gently with soap and water in:
	2 hours 4 hours 6-8 hours
	Leave on overnight Once a blister has formed
	If you do not remove the chemical, further blistering will occur.
3.	For treatment of the blister sites, cleanse daily with an antibacterial soap and apply Polysporin or Vaseline ointment and a band-aid. There may be some discomfort from the blister sites. Motrin or Tylenol may be used if needed.
a s red	the first treatment, only a few lesions may be treated as a "test" to make sure the patient does not have evere reaction to Cantharidin (this is rare). If a severe reaction does occur (large blistering, intense lness, swelling and pain), please call the office at 205.871.7332. Another treatment option will have to used instead.
